

Appendix: Breakdown of Each Township's Crime/Incident Data



For more than a decade, the Sheriff's Office has provided coverage for the 459 square miles of the County by dividing patrol units into seven districts. In 2016, an eighth district was added, which overlaps the two busiest *Townships* – *those with the* highest call volumes. This enhanced coverage reduces the need to pull deputies out of other districts, thus ensuring all residents receive the coverage they deserve, regardless in what part of the *County they reside.* 

### Sheriff's Message

The morning after five officers were killed in Dallas, I asked my executive assistant to cancel my appointments for the day. I just wanted to spend the day riding in the field with our deputies. There was little discussion about what had happened, yet the mood among the deputies was somber. I wasn't surprised. Despite the tragedy and ongoing rhetoric in the national media regarding our nation's law enforcement officers, I simply watched as our deputies went about their jobs in a most professional manner. 2016 may have been a tumultuous year for law enforcement nationally, but I could not have been more proud of what our Office—your Office—accomplished.



I trust as you review our 2016 Annual Report that you will come to the same conclusions that I have reached during my five years as the Sheriff of Delaware County, Ohio. That our deputies, corrections officers, and support staff are committed to maintaining the banner as one of Ohio's finest Sheriff's Offices.

But we're not satisfied. Leadership within the Office is committed to improvement on all levels. Our desire is to provide quality service, both efficiently and effectively, to all those we serve. We work in a vibrant and fast-growing county and we believe that people are moving to Delaware County in record numbers because of opportunities and the quality of life. Your Delaware County Sheriff's Office will remain vigilant in assuring the freedoms we cherish in this great nation. Our vision should be your expectation: protecting people, their property, and their Constitutional rights.



## **Personnel & Training**

The 206 members of the Delaware County Sheriff's Office receive regular training in a variety of disciplines and we often exceed the state minimum training requirements. In 2016, staff completed 7,829 hours of training.

To help address the community's heroin/opioid problem, a new partnership was forged in 2016 between the five public school districts, the Delaware-Morrow Mental Health & Recovery Services Board, and the Sheriff's Office. The result was the creation of the Delaware County drug liaison, who serves as a one-stop resource, providing education and prevention, treatment information, referrals, and assistance to any community member.



## **Financials**


The Delaware County Sheriff's Office is a tax-supported operation, with the majority of funding generated by local taxes. The Delaware County Commissioners allocate the necessary amount so that this Office meets the statutory requirements of a county sheriff's office. In addition, the Sheriff's Office budget is supplemented by several other funding streams, such as State and Federal grants, drug seizure funds, housing of federal prisoners, OVI court fines, and fees collected for the sole purpose of running the Concealed Handgun License program. The Sheriff's Office also contributes to Delaware County's general fund through other funding sources such as inmate charges, foreclosed property sales, and special duty cruiser fees, to name a few.

### **Crime/Incidents Overview**



- 2016 Highlights, as compared to 2015 Totals:
  - ◊ 23% decrease in identify theft calls/reports
  - ◊ 9% fewer thefts from vehicles
  - ◊ 6% less breaking and entering incidents
  - ◊ 7% rise in thefts
  - ◊ 8% increase in domestics
- The large percent of traffic stops above (38%) is due in part to citizens requesting increased speed enforcement in residential neighborhoods.

### **Detective Division**

Detectives were assigned 496 cases and 48 employment backgrounds in 2016, with the following noteworthy cases.

- Imposter Susan Gwynne was indicted on 101 counts of burglary and theft, after she stole from the elderly in dozens of rest homes. Sentenced to 65 years in prison.
- The "Buckeye Bandit" (Ikechi Emeaghara) was captured by Columbus Police after multiple robberies, thanks in large part to evidence we recovered from the First Merit Bank case in Delaware County.
- After shooting his roommate, Chris Sidders was arrested, convicted, and sentenced to 11 years in prison. The roommate survived.

### **Delaware Tactical Unit**

This highly specialized unit is a multijurisdictional task force, operating under the authority of the Sheriff's Office. Here is the DTU's activity for 2016.

- ♦ 13 Search warrants
- ♦ 3 Arrest warrants
- ♦ 3 Barricades
- 1 each of area search, protection detail, support operations and surveillance.

### **Crisis Negotiations Team**

The CNT is a highly trained unit, which often works alongside our Tactical Unit, as peaceful resolution is the Office's ultimate goal. The CNT's 2016 activity follows.

- 14 Search and/or arrest warrants
- ♦ 2 Suicidal barricades
- Dozens of suicidal threats

## Victims' Services

The Sheriff's victims services advocate works with victims of misdemeanor crimes, helping them maneuver the court process, understand their rights, and link them to community resources. In 2016, 495 cases went through Municipal Court, on the following charges.

- ♦ 206 Domestic Violence
- ♦ 140 Assault & Aggravated Menacing
- ♦ 65 Protection Order Violation & Harassment

### **Patrol Division**

Deputies responded to 43,548 calls for service in 2016. Here's a closer look at their activity.

- ◆ 7,259 reports taken a 15% increase over 2015.
- 1,405 arrests with 6,180 charges filed.
- 18% of our deputies' time was spent on traffic stops, with more than 2,600 manpower hours.
- More than 1,400 manpower hours were dedicated to business and house checks, ensuring all was well.
- 1,000 manpower hours were spent on follow-up/ investigations (does not include the detective division investigations).
- 23% increase in the number of requests by other agencies for our assistance, further illustrating the strong collaborative, mutual-aid relationship in law enforcement.

### **Drug Task Force**

This multijurisdictional unit consists of nine detectives, an analyst, and one support staff. The DTF's activity in 2016 yielded the following results.

- 90 new cases with 21 arrests & 27 indictments
- 1,735 intelligence complaints/tips
- 4,323 grams of Heroin seized, 107 grams Crack Cocaine, 35 grams Cocaine, 7,831 grams of Marijuana, & 514 unit doses (pills/liquid) prescription medicines
- ♦ \$497,560 in drug seizure money





## **Concealed Handgun Licensing**



Per state law, residents may apply for or renew their license in the county where they reside, or a contiguous county. The Office extended hours in 2016, adding additional appointment times, which contributed to the significant increase in new licenses issued. We saw a 102% increase over 2015 in new licenses issued.

## **Sheriff Sales**

By statute, the local sheriff's office is required to act as agent for all foreclosed properties in the county. In 2016, 271 orders of sale were entered in the Sheriff Sales database. Of that, 131 properties were sold for a total sale value of \$22 million. The average house price sold was \$168,644.

## **Mounted Unit**

The six members of this unit serve mostly in a ceremonial and special events capacity, but assist with crowd control situations. In 1996, it was the Mounted Deputies who started the Shop with a Cop event, serving 12 children that first year. Today, more than 115 children participate and the mounted deputies continue to play an integral role in this annual community event.

## **School Resource Officers**

The eight deputies comprising this unit work inside the four public school districts within our jurisdiction — Big Walnut, Buckeye Valley, Delaware Area Career Center, and Olentangy. (Delaware City Police provides SROs to the Delaware City school district.)

Prevention, safety, and self-esteem are just some of the curriculum taught in an age appropriate manner for k-12 students. Deputies serve as mentors to students of all ages.

## Weight Enforcement Unit

Sheriff's offices are required to provide weight enforcement on commercial vehicles operating on county roadways.

  - $\diamond~$  38% exceeded the gross weight
  - $\diamond~$  42% violated the axle weight loads
  - ◊ 9% inner-bridge violation
  - $\diamond$  11% no violation


## **Internships & Explorers**

The Sheriff's Office provides two highly structured and hands-on *internship* programs:

◆ 10-week long, 40 hours/week *paid summer college internship* for a student going into their junior or senior year, who is studying law enforcement/criminal justice or related field at a four-year accredited college/university.

♦ 4-month long, 12 hours/week high school internship for four high school students either enrolled at the Delaware Area Career Center law enforcement program or who are participating in Explorers.

Our *Explorers program* is for anyone age 14 to 21, who is interested in pursuing a career in law enforcement. Explorers receive intense training and participate in a variety of drills and district competition, covering topics such as criminal investigations, search and arrest procedures, defensive weapons and tactics, first-aid and officer down training, and much more. ## **Corrections & Jail Programming**

Below is a sampling of jail programming, inmate composition, and other statistics and accomplishments from 2016.

- ♦ 4,165 inmate bookings/admissions
- 2,515 misdemeanor offenses; 1,571 felony offenses; and 79 federal offenses
- 244 was the average daily inmate population; with 78% male and 22% female
- Race: 77% White; 19% Black; 3% Hispanic; 1% (Other, American Indian, Asian, Middle Eastern, Unknown)
- ◆ 55.5% rate of recidivism a nearly 12% decrease—fewer—repeat offenders since 2015
- 353 inmates reported being homeless upon their booking into the Jail
- ♦ 578 inmates were identified as having mental health issues, a 20% increase from 2015
- 67% increase over 2015 in the number of inmates placed on medical protocol for opiate/heroin withdraw
- An average of 12 inmates each month were placed on suicide watch (2015's average was 16/month)
- 11 inmates lives were saved by Corrections Officers and medical staff.
- Added 37 new Volunteers/Community Partners, totaling 133 Active Volunteers (GED, AA & NA, Bible studies, etc.)
- 57% increase over 2015 in admissions to the Recovery & Reentry Program
- 18 inmates referred to the Justice Veteran Outreach Specialist
- 16 men graduated from the Father Factor program



In 2016, the Delaware County Sheriff's Office implemented its first-ever Corrections Academy, which was taught solely by Sheriff's Office staff. Held at the Delaware Area Career Center, this 3 1/2-week long program covered 143 hours of state-mandated training.

Here are a few highlights from the *Stepping Up Initiative*, a nationwide effort which aims to reduce the number of incarcerations of persons with mental illness.

- A Rapid Engagement Specialist position created by Maryhaven, for immediate access to services for both substance abuse and mental health clients.
- System-wide definition of mental illness and substance abuse was adopted to consistently identify the population.
- Mental health screening and risk assessments now administered by Common Pleas Court Pretrial Services to provide more informed bail/bond recommendations to arraignment judges.
- ♦ Grace Resource Navigation Program began, utilizing trained volunteers/navigators to provide jail in-reach support services and connect people to community based services upon release.
- O The Jacob Edward Walls Foundation is collaboratively working with the Reentry Coalition and Community of Grace to establish a Unity Center/Sober Living House in Delaware County to provide information, direct services, and convenient access to other community resources in a welcoming, supportive setting.

### 2016 In Memoriam

On January 7, 2016, our Concealed Handgun License expert, colleague, and friend, **Pamela Johnston**, passed at the age of 49, from complications of multiple myeloma.

A graduate of Chapman University, Pam served with the Sheriff's Office for five years. Sheriff Russell Martin said, "Pam always had a positive outlook and never asked for anyone's pity. She wanted to be at work every day and she refused to give up. She had a great sense of humor and a survivor's attitude."
