PATROL & SPECIALTY UNITS

- ↑ 26% increase in DOMESTIC VIOLENCE charges, totaling 106.
- ↑ 18% increase in thefts (from vehicles, of credit cards, and retail).
- \downarrow 9% decrease in harassments, from 207 in 2021 to 189 in 2022.
- \downarrow 3% decrease in SUICIDE ATTEMPTS, from 150 in 2021 to 145 in 2022; and a significant decrease of completed suicides, from 14 to 6.
- \downarrow 60% decrease in DRUG OVERDOSES, from 124 in 2021 to 49 in 2022.
- ↓ 10% decrease in OD DEATHS, from 21 in 2021 to 19 in 2022.
- Drug Task Force seized 37,311 grams of meth, 13,001 grams of fentanyl, and 9,030 grams of heroin.
- 384 K-9 call-outs, of which 72% (273) were narcotics searches/detections.

DISPATCH & ADMINISTRATIVE

- ▶ 13 dispatchers took 34,544 CALLS for service that's 2,657 calls/dispatcher.
- ▶ 8% increase in PUBLIC RECORDS requests—5,024 in 2021 to 5,446 in 2022.
- ▶ 3,740 property items obtained/logged, and 195 firearms confiscated.

STAFFING: 238 employees, of which 20% are supervisors.


BREAKDOWN: 121 deputies, 58 corrections officers, 13 dispatchers, and 46 civilians. 34% of staff

are female and 4% are black.

TRAINING: 23,038 hours of training were completed by all staff.

FINANCIALS

The Sheriff's Office 2022 *budgeted* expenditures was \$32,061,107, with *actual* expenditures coming in at \$30,477,226. The charts below show how the expenditures were allocated, with Patrol & Administrative totaling \$20,738,871; Jail at \$9,276,459 and Other at \$461,896.















JAIL & COURT SERVICES

JAIL:

☑ Earned 100% Compliance on the State's annual inspection.

☑ 2,479 inmate bookings at the Jail — a 13% decrease from 2021; and the average length of stay was 18 days.

BREAKDOWN: 74% of inmates were male, 26% female; 66% were white, 28% black, and 6% other; and 68% of inmates reside outside of the County with 32% from Delaware County.

☑ The rate of recidivism was 9% for those participating in the recovery and re-entry programs; that rate jumped to 54% for the remaining jail population.

☑ 120 volunteers led 2,600 hours of programs for inmates in the jail.

TRANSPORT: 1,749 inmate transports to medical, court, etc.—a 38% increase.

WARRANTS & CIVIL PAPERS: 459 warrants served, resulting in arrest; and 3,037 civil papers service attempted—up 11% from 2021's total of 2,746.

VICTIMS SUPPORT: 278 cases supported in court by our Victims Advocates, who also provide services for nine additional law enforcement agencies in the County.

COMMUNITY & OUTREACH

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS taught 17,663 students a total of 680 hours of safety curriculum & drug prevention throughout 38 school buildings in the 2021-2022 school year. ▶ 1,416 CONCEALED CARRY LICENSES issued/renewed in 2022—down 53%. (Ohio law changed in June 2022, no longer requiring a concealed carry permit.) SHERIFF SALES received 29 County foreclosures, with an average property sale price of

▶ 16 residents graduated from our CITIZENS SHERIFF ACADEMY program.

> 500 kindergarten & 1st graders attended SAFETY TOWN over the summer.

> 90 at-risk youth were served at our annual SHOP WITH A COP program.

▶ Implemented our first-ever THERAPY K9 program, resulting in 80 community service events/call-outs by K9 Otto and his handler.
